The alarm message provides the precise location and nature of the incident. For instance: "Emergency in Judge Smith's chambers, respond immediately."

As SecureTech's president, Juliana Goldenberg, notes, "The WAVE transmits alarms to officers instantly without any dispatch delay. When a situation becomes violent, time is everything. Seconds count. While 30 seconds of dispatch delay may not seem like much when things are calm, it is an extremely long time when someone is attacking you."
